1. Home Care Nurses

Description: The Tompkins County Health Department Home Health Care program seeks a quality pool of applicants for one full-time CHN position and one Per-Diem Community Health Nurse to serve the growing client caseload on the Home Care team. \$53,017 2008 Hire Rate - Based on 40 hour work week. Full-time nurses work a 35-work week Monday through Friday with the equivalent of only one weekend and two weeknights on-call every 3 months. Per-Diems work a minimum of two weekends and six weeknights on-call every 3 months. All on-call time is paid by visit or shift with exceptional reimbursement rates. Nurses use laptops in the home and office to complete documentation and are equipped with a cell phone, assessment equipment and medical supplies.

3. Dispositional Alternatives Program

Description: The Dispositional Alternatives Program (DAP), a community-based, family-centered program, provides comprehensive, supportive services to youth, aged seven to 18, and their families. Through counseling, case management, enrichment activities, family meetings, and referrals and follow-up services, DAP fosters positive changes in behavior and attitude for youth who are having difficulties at home, school, or in the community. We're looking for three interns who can work 16 hours/week. The hours are determined by our group activities, and are usually mid-day. Friday morning staff meetings from 9-11 am are also required. The internship offers a stipend. Interns plan and execute one special activity for the summer for a group of kids. In the past this has ranged from a picnic by the lake to tie-dye, outdoor challenges (like building a bridge or a structure) to field days and water balloon fights to tree planting. Whatever your passion is, we hope it finds a place in our program this summer! The internship runs June 26th-August 21st. I will be conducting intern interviews next week. Interviews will be conducted at 204 North Cayuga Street.
